## Burnside gets ready for take-off

BURNSIDE State High School is really taking off in a variety of ways.

The school has now hit its capacity of 880 and to enrol, prospective students must be in its catchment area, be accepted for an excellence program, or have made an out-of-catchment application.

And it seems the sky's the limit for the future, with Burnside setting a goal of becoming a school of excellence in aviation.

The school has secured a donated plane, needing to be rebuilt, and is only one of two schools that have been sponsored by the Sport Aircraft Association of Australia to assist in building a plane.

The plane to be built is an RV-12, that has been ordered and will be arriving in mid to late April. Plans will be issued soon so staff can get started on the curricular activities with the students.

Principal Kerri Dunn said regional project managers were in direct contact with the school and staff were readying students for the plane's delivery.
