About the SAAA

For the past 66 years, the Sport Aircraft Association of Australia (SAAA), has and continues to be a group of aviation enthusiasts, assisting each other to build, maintain and operate sport aircraft. We educate our Members to continuously improve safety outcomes. The SAAA has changed in recent years. The organisation has gone from a club to a properly run national business that is respected by the Regulator for its consistency and focus. The current National Council are working hard to rebuild the foundations to professionalise and modernise SAAA. Here are some highlights from the last five years:

- Developed a modern website with a continuous growth of information from Chapter details, technical and administrative support along with technical and corporate reference centres
- Developed and streamlined a new Chapter Charter reducing the administrative burden on Chapter leaders
- Put in place a Chapter Funding Scheme to support all SAAA Chapters
- Established our Flight Operations Support to members with a team of formally appointed FSA's and our own Flight Instructors to deliver Type Transition Training – all managed under our CASA approved Flight Training and Safety Manual (FTSM)
- Commenced work to build Flight Reviews into FTSM
- Established our Safety Management System which includes our own Occurrence Management System
- Continue to advocate on behalf of our Members
- Engagement in the relevant Senate RRAT Committee hearings
- Submissions to Senate Committees, CASA and Air Services
- Development of a Maintenance Techniques Course (MTC) which has been encouraged by CASA
- Investing in the future through the engagement of young Australians with our SAAA Youth Build & Fly Program

We are building a stronger SAAA that is sustainable, is supported by an established technical and administrative team, and is less reliant on volunteers to manage the business. All SAAA Board Members and technical staff / advisors are experienced aviators in their own right; most are volunteers collectively contributing over 5000 hours/year to SAAA. We consider ourselves very fortunate to have such a capable and committed team supporting SAAA and its Members.

SAAA Sponsored Youth Build & Fly Program

We are proud to have our Youth Build Program. Launched in November 2019, five schools around Australia are taking part in our first project to build a Vans RV12.

Schools are located in Queensland, Victoria, New South Wales and Western Australia. Our Members have had the opportunity to give back and have inspired our youth to become involved in aviation. We have a number of chapter Members who have volunteered their time to mentor the students. Everyone has really enjoyed being involved and giving something back, and a great reason to continue building an aircraft!

This is not the first time SAAA has built aircraft. Back in 1994 a Kitfox was built and raffled. The profits went towards renovations and new office equipment at HQ in Victoria. A Jabiru was constructed in 1997 and the profits went towards replacing the roof at HQ.

Maintenance Techniques Course

SAAA has been working towards developing a Maintenance Techniques Course that will, with CASA approval, qualify all owners to conduct maintenance. The course has been beta tested by a number of SAAA Members which included TC's, MPC trainers and LAME's. The feedback has been that it is a great course. We are now waiting for CASA to expedite their approval of the course, in order that we can start delivering it to our Members.
